Fatimah (S.A) was bestowed with two titles; "az-Zahra," which means "The Resplendent One," in reference to her radiant face. She also had the title "al-Batul," referring to her pure character. If we examine her short life, we can see that she was an inspiration, one who embodied the qualities of courage, loyalty, humility and selflessness.

Lady Fatima (S.A) was well known for her compassionate and gentle personality. She was generous, helping the poor and needy; often she would give her food away even if it meant going hungry herself.

She lived a very simple and humble life, without any care for luxuries.

Prophet Muhammad. (P.B.U.H&H.P) identified Lady Fatimah (S.A) as one of the "best women in Paradise along with Mary, Asiya, and Khadija"
